



# **Total FY 24 New Investment: \$682M**



\$1,000 per-student investment increase



\$4,766 average teacher pay increase



59% increase in public school funding (\$1.55B) over the last 6 years!

# FY 24 Education Budget Agreement





## Formula Funding: \$500M

HB 2901 | SB 1119 | HB 2902

### Teacher Pay: \$285M

- Experienced-based teacher pay raise
  - \$3,000 (0-4 years)
  - \$4,000 (5-9 years)
  - \$5,000 (10-14 years)
  - \$6,000 (15+ years)
- · Adjusts minimum salary schedule
- Certified Employees
  - CareerTech, Corrections/OJA, School for Deaf, School for Blind
  - Not required for superintendents/retirees
  - Includes same raise for those paid above minimum
- Funds Off-Formula Schools
  - State Board of Education budget

#### Additional State Aid: \$215M

- Weight Adjustments (HB 2902)
  - Transportation 1.39 to 2
  - Economically Disadvantaged .25 to .3
  - Small School 529 ADM to 750 ADM
- Inflationary Costs Offset
- Investment Opportunities
  - Student support services
    - Nurses, counselors, behavior specialists, etc.
  - Support staff raises
  - New/expanded academic or extracurricular programs

HB 2901 requires private school/homeschool tax credit reduction if state aid/redbud funding falls below FY24 level



## **Redbud Funding: \$125M** HB 2901 | SB 1120

- Increases the funding level to highest possible percentage based on money available
- 416 school districts (estimated) will receive Redbud, 100 district increase



## Safety Pilot: \$50M

HB 2903 | HB 2904

- \$150M over 3 years
- School Resource Officers
- Physical security improvements



# **Literacy Pilot: \$3.3M**

SB 1118

- \$10M over 3 years
- Literacy instruction teams



## **Maternity Leave**

SB 1121

- 6-week leave for mothers who have worked in same district for a year
- State funded
